# **Sara Jane Rothwell**

Sara Jane has run her successful garden design practice in North London for eight years

# What do you wish you'd known when you started out as a designer?

That design would account for less than 20 percent of running a design business. The rest is spent on emailing, client communication, problem-solving, site visits, and keeping people happy.

## What has surprised you most in your career?

How transferable my skills as a film art director have been to garden design. The client is like the film director, the landscape team like the set construction team, the budget is tight, and the deadlines are the same.

#### Your favourite styles of architecture?

Zaha Hadid for creating architecture that expresses freedom and strength of spirit; Frank Gehry for his sensuous giant sculptures brought to life; Tadao Ando for his breathtaking use of space and light; and, finally, Gaudi for his sheer originality.

## What are your favourite materials to work with in the garden?

Natural stone and wood – they breathe life into a garden.

### What part of the design process do you like best?

Brainstorming the initial concept – especially that 'eureka' moment when it all falls into place on paper.

And what is the part you like least? Dealing with difficult neighbours.

### Do you prefer hand-drawn or CAD designs?

CAD designs for their speed and versatility, hand-drawn for their personality.
